Tips and Thoughts

In keeping with our eco-management strategies, we thought we'd share a "green cleaning" recipe with you, as you do your fall cleaning:

Tub, Toilet, Sink Cleanser

- Baking soda
- Castile soap or Murphy's Oil soap
- Rag or washcloth (lasts longer than a sponge and can be easily and sanitarly cleaned)

Sprinkle baking soda on porcelain fixtures and rub with a wet rag. Add a few drops of soap to the rag for more cleaning power. Rinse well to avoid leaving a hazy film.

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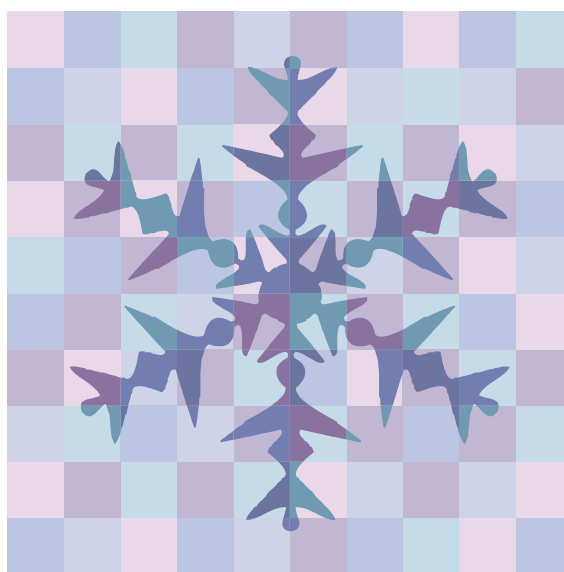
Skally Management Philosophies:
