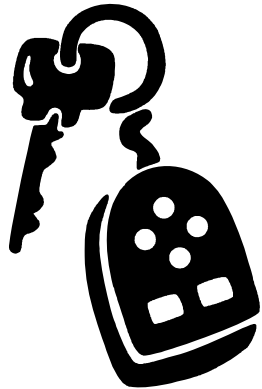

Security Update

There have been increased auto thefts in the neighborhood. Here are some tips to prevent auto theft:

1) Always lock your car when you leave it unattended, even if your vehicle is parked in front of your home or alley. CD players, purses, store packages, and other personal items left in plain view in your car can be very tempting lures for "crimes of opportunity".

2) Stow valuables in your trunk if at all possible. Remember that SUVs and van-type vehicles without trunks are especially vulnerable since valuables can easily be seen.
